church in the midst of a storm rowing as hard as we can meanwhile no one considers offering a prayer to the Lord of the Sea. OK, a guilt inducing question: Why is it so hard to get the church together just to pray?

"Be courageous. I Am. Don't be afraid."

These are the words spoken by the Lord of the Church to His Church. These are the words we live by in feast and famine, when life is good and when life is hard, when the biopsy is benign and when the diagnosis is bleak. Fearlessness is the by-product of knowing the identity of the One before whom we bow. Response?

Sermon Reflection Guide

Mark 6.45-52

Immediately he made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

When evening came, the boat was out on the sea, and he was alone on the land. When he saw that they were straining at the oars against an adverse wind, he came towards them early in the morning, walking on the sea. He intended to pass them by. But when they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out; for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Then he got into the boat with them and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded, for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened.

Question for Everyone

When faced with a daunting task or insurmountable odds I (1) map out a strategy, create a plan and then execute that plan or (10) I pray as if it all depended on God. Where would you place yourself on this range?

The Other Side of the Sea

I don't know why Jesus had to insist that his disciples set sail for Bethsaida. It could be that the other side of the sea represents difficult encounters with less than hospitable folk, precisely the sort of people Jesus finds not the least bit intimidating. Jesus seems insistent that his people not get too cozy with their current situation. There is a sea to cross and people to love and a message to declare about the nearness of the realm of God, and of course those pesky unclean spirits that need clearing out. So how cozy are you currently? Any chance your coziness is diminishing your ability to fully follow Jesus?

An Audacious Claim

It is obvious that Mark wants us to hear echoes of Moses' encounter with Yahweh on Mount Sinai when Jesus goes up to the mountain to pray (v.46). But Mark makes it exceedingly clear that Jesus is much more than Moses 2.0. When he comes down he intends to "pass by" his disciples like Yahweh (Exodus 33.19, 22), and has authority over the stormy sea like Yahweh. And if that weren't clear enough Jesus himself says, "I Am" just like Yahweh in that burning bush (Ex. 3.14). Any Ancient Near Eastern Jewish person reading this story would be gobsmacked by the audacious claim of this narrative. Jesus does things and says things that only God could do and say. When is the last time that the authority of Jesus was so fully demonstrated in your life that you ended up, of your own free will by the prompting of the Spirit, in a place that you would rather not have been? Tell the story.

Prayer for the Coming Week

This week, offer this simple prayer: Lord, whom might I include at my table? Does Jesus have the authority to place people at your family dinner table? Will our rhetoric of divine inclusion be more than a slogan in that we find ourselves providing hospitality to folk we would not have previously considered?

Row Harder

What do the disciples do in light of Jesus' apparent absence? They row harder. This is a vivid portrait of the church, not just then, but now. There we are the
