Sermon Reflection Guide Second Sunday of Advent 2016

Isaiah 11.1-9

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins. The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den. They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord

as the waters cover the sea.

Sanctuary

We must insure that our space is a sanctuary in the fullest sense, a place consecrated for worship *and* a safe place for all people. Do you consider our community to be a safe place? Why? Why not?

Question for Everyone:

(1) I'm a follower/(10) I'm a leader. (1) I feel threatened/ (10) I feel safe. Where are you on these spectrums?

The Vulnerable

"Like Ezekiel's dry bones, these dead tree stumps are an indictment against a fruitless and fearful people who had placed their trust in political maneuvers and compromising alliances. They had failed in their fundamental mission to take care of the vulnerable." Why does God care about the vulnerable? Who are the vulnerable in your arena of influence?

Israel's God

We have a beautiful mission; it is the mission of gathering up humble people into God's loving embrace so as to abolish all the oppressive elements that keep humans from flourishing (from sinful habits so systemic injustice). At her best Israel remembered that she worshiped the God who hears the cry of the oppressed.

Leadership

Leadership is a tricky word in our culture. It is fraught with the baggage of leaders who lead in order to win rather than serve, leaders who use their power to bully rather than nurture, leaders who manipulate rather than collaborate. Do you consider yourself a leader? What is the context of your leadership?

Righteous Leadership

You can be sure that righteousness will often entail empowering the weak, befriending the friendless, or confronting a bully peacefully. Do you see the righteous need in your arena of influence? What does righteousness require of you now?
