



Sermon Five: "Good News for Grumblers"

Luke 15.1-3, 25-32

Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

So he told them this parable:

"Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has

devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him! 'Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'"

Question for Everyone:

(1) I'm not much for parties. I'd rather curl up with a good book or enjoy a long conversation with a friend. (10) I love a big, boisterous party. I may not be the first to arrive but I am always the last to leave. Where are you on this "party" spectrum?

Grumbling

"The stories about the lost sheep, lost coin, and lost son were Jesus' rebuttal to the religious professional's grumbling about Jesus' subversive act of radical hospitality." Are you a grumbler, a mutterer, a complainer? What makes you grumble?

Winsome Hospitality

"One could make the case that the early churches' success in the Book of Acts was due to their winsome hospitality. Winsome hospitality is, in part, about considering the needs of your guests." Do you consider yourself a good host? Why? Why not?

Life Together

"If you follow Jesus, I promise you he will lead you into His community. Life in the Way of Jesus is not a solitary pursuit. Always remember, our God is a gathering God. Claiming faith in Jesus without being engaged in Christian community is like claiming to play for the NFL while only ever playing Madden football." Response?

The Putrid Stench of Grace Gone Bad

"There is nothing more pernicious and nothing less attractive than a religious person whose faith is motivated by duty rather than love.

There is nothing so putrid as the aroma of grace gone bad." How do you keep grace alive and fresh in your life?

Good News for Grumblers

"People are being gathered into reign of God around My table, stop grumbling and join the party. There is grace enough for everyone!' This is Jesus' message to the religious people who were grumbling about his table fellowship." How does this message speak to you? Are you more like the Prodigal or the Elder Son?

Baptism Orientation Spring 2016
