Sermon Series: “40 Days”

Sermon Six: “*Shouting Stone Sunday*”

Luke 19.28-40

After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, “Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, ‘Why are you untying it?’ just say this, ‘The Lord needs it.’” So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, “Why are you untying the colt?” They said, “The Lord needs it.” Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying,

“Blessed is the king

who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven,

and glory in the highest heaven!”

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, “Teacher, order your disciples to stop.” He answered, “I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.

Question for Everyone

(1) I do not trust people in authority and am the first voice to decry the misuse of power. (10) I trust people in authority and assume the best even when their authority seems to have been misused. Where are you on this spectrum?

Palm Sunday in Orvieto

“We stumbled upon the church quietly preparing for Palm Sunday worship as their forbearers had for centuries. To which part of the story are you drawn?

What did Luke Do with the Palm Branches?

“If we only had Luke’s Gospel, Palm Sunday would not be called Palm Sunday. It might be called “Donkey Sunday” or “Throw

No Ordinary King

“Luke’s message is clear: Jesus is King but not the sort of King that the folk expected or wanted. Jesus is King, but he is King of the outcast and the outsider. He is King of the humble heart and the gentle of spirit. He bumps into our town on the back of a donkey not on the white horse of violent conquest. He hangs enthroned on a cross wearing a crown of thorns. This is our King.” How do you respond to this image of Jesus on the back of a donkey?
