Sermon Series "It's Sunday, but Monday's Coming"

Sermon Four: "Commanding Love"

John 13.31-35

When he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.

Question for Everyone

(1) Love is something I feel. (10) Love is something I do. Where are you on this spectrum?

Into the Darkness

"This is, sadly, the journey many Jesus people make. They grow up in the church having learned to love and trust Jesus. But then something happens, other allegiances begin to encroach, doubt begins to cloud their vision, attending the

means of grace in daily prayer and meditation and weekly worship becomes sporadic. And then they are gone." Talk about why people leave the church. Is there a common thread in their departure stories?

"Never forget, one can believe all the right things about Jesus. One may memorize the 16 Articles of faith of the Church of the Nazarene and recite the Apostles Creed with perfection while at the same time moving from Light to darkness." How does this happen?

Glory

"In John's Gospel Jesus is "lifted up." Which refers simultaneously to Jesus' crucifixion and his ascension (his being lifted up on the cross and lifted up into the glory of God's presence). This, lifting up, is Jesus' enthronement. In John's Gospel, Jesus' crucifixion is Jesus' enthronement. Jesus' crucifixion is the explicit revelation of God's glory. . . . The epicenter of this glory is that moment when Jesus was lifted up, enthroned on a cross as our Passover Lamb." What then, might it mean to live to the glory of God?

Love One Another

"This is Jesus' mission statement for his church: "Love one another as I have loved you." I've never known a church to make that their mission statement." Why not?

Commanding Love

"Commandment? Can love be commanded? The word does sound out of place, especially to those of us who have not only deleted 'command' and 'obey' from our vocabularies but who also use 'love' in terms of emotion. To command emotions would most likely be counterproductive. But what if love is not an emotion? What if love is the way God *acts* toward the world and the way Jesus *acts* toward his disciples (Fred Craddock)? Response?

Hard Truth

"Our church has endured at least 10 years of slow but steady decline." What are your expectations for the growth of our church? Do you think about our churches' health and vitality? What keeps us from being as healthy and vital as we can be? Jesus offers us his church growth strategy. "By loving one another as I have loved you, everyone will know that you are my disciples." How is this a church growth strategy? Is it possible for a church to be healthy and vital and not enjoy numerical growth?
