Sermon Reflection Guide For Personal Reflection and Communal Conversation The Seventh Sunday of Easter, 8 May 2016 Sermon Series "It's Sunday, but Monday's Coming" Sermon Six: "One"

John 17.20-26

"I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world."

Question for Everyone:

(1) I never pray. (10) I'm never not praying. Where are you on this prayer spectrum?

A Word from the Lord?

There are some parts of the Bible that seem very remote. We read them and then we are left scratching our heads as to how these particular words could possibly be speaking to us. (Any passages come to mind?) Christians come to the Scriptures and the preaching moment within the context of corporate worship with the foundational assumption that the God of Jesus Christ speaks to God's people. We read the Scriptures daily and listen to the word preached weekly in order to hear a word from the Lord. (When you engage the Scriptures are you listening for a word from the Lord? What might happen to the way you listen to sermons, no matter the skill of the preacher, if you were listening for a word from the Lord?)

God is Revealed Not Created

I find the revelation of One God in three Persons compelling because this God was most certainly not created by the human mind. This God was revealed to us not constructed by us. Jesus is the second person of the Triune God fully human and fully divine. This sentence is a grammar made possible through revelation not human ingenuity. (Responses? Why does any of this matter?)

Monday's Coming

John won't let us stop thinking about the church on Monday after we've left the Sunday gathering. Jesus won't let us pray his prayer known by some as the "Our Father" without acknowledging the community to which we belong. Part of living Easter Sunday hope on Monday is about never forgetting your Jesus tribe. (Response?)

Praying the Way Jesus Prays

Maybe our first response to this text isn't wringing our hands about all the ways we fail to live in unity. Perhaps the first response is to simply learn to pray for the things for which Jesus prayed, like unity among Christians. (How would your prayer life change if you began to pray the way Jesus prayed? Think about the things for which Jesus prayed.)
