Justified

“Justified” means to be reckoned by God to be a true member of his family, and hence with the right to share table fellowship. For Paul, justification always had in mind God’s declaration of membership, and that this always referred specifically to the coming together of Jews and Gentiles in faithful membership of the Christian family” (N.T. Wright). (How does this definition challenge/inform your understanding of justification?)

Galatians 2.11-21

But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood self-condemned; for until certain people came from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles. But after they came, he drew back and kept himself separate for fear of the circumcision faction. And the other Jews joined him in this hypocrisy, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. But when I saw that they were not acting consistently with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, “If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews?”

We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; yet we know that a person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. And we have come to believe in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by doing the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law. But if, in our effort to be justified in Christ, we ourselves have been found to be sinners, is Christ then a servant of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again the very things that I once tore down, then I demonstrate that I am a transgressor. For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not nullify the grace of God; for if justification comes through the law, then Christ died for nothing.

Question for Everyone

(1) After making a decision I never look back and I never change my mind even when the facts change. (10) After making a decision I immediately begin second-guessing and vacillating. Where are you on this spectrum?

The Best Meal Ever

If you could choose your last meal, what would it be? Think about the persons with whom you regularly eat. What does this list say about you? Think about the best meal you ever had. Tell the story.

Peter Changed His Mind

Peter had shared a table, not just any table but the agape feast, the table of Jesus, with ex-pagans. This radical table fellowship was the central sign of God’s new creation breaking into the present.

But now, because of fear or peer pressure or political maneuvering, Peter had changed his mind, even Barnabas has been swayed by the “circumcision faction.” (Why do you think Peter stopped eating with Gentiles?)

Around the Same Table

At its heart, the book of Galatians is not about circumcision, it’s about whether or not Jewish Christians and Jewish Gentiles belong at the same table. And so the word “justified” must be tethered very closely to the practice of table-fellowship and the way one gain access to the Table, the Table being the sign of membership into God’s family. (Are you an includer or an excluder?)
