Galatians 1.11-24

For I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. But when God, who had set me apart before I was born and called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with any human being, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were already apostles before me, but I went away at once into Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus.

Then after three years I did go up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and stayed with him fifteen days; but I did not see any other apostle except James the Lord's brother. In what I am writing to you, before God, I do not lie! Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia, and I was still unknown by sight to the churches of Judea that are in Christ; they only heard it said, "The one who formerly was persecuting us is now proclaiming the faith he once tried to destroy."

Question for Everyone: (1) People never change. A person's past behavior is the greatest predictor of a person's present behavior. (10) People can and do change sometimes fundamentally and profoundly and this happens more than you'd think. Where are you on this "transformation" spectrum?

Paul

"And whenever he had ten minutes to spare he wrote letters. And in these letters . . . He coaxed. He comforted. He confronted He cursed. He coerced. He reminisced. He complained. He theologized. He inspired. He insulted. He lamented. He lambasted. He emoted." (How do you respond to Paul? What do you think it would be like to have Paul in your church?)

Paul's Passion

Everything he ever said or wrote or did from that day forward was an attempt to rouse the human race as he'd been roused. (How passionate are you for your faith? Let's say 1 = Eeyore and 10 = Paul. Where are you on this scale?)

Paul the Terrorist

Sadly Paul wouldn't be the last zealot to kill, persecute, or cause suffering to others in the name of God. I have discovered along the way that the most zealous people are sometimes the most harmful to Christian community if their zeal isn't transformed by love. (How do you respond to the word "zeal"?)
