Amos 5.21-24, 6.4-7,

I hate, I despise your festivals,
and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies.

Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them;
and the offerings of well- being of your fatted animals
I will not look upon.

Take away from me the noise of your songs;

I will not listen to the melody of your harps.

Church of the Nazarene

"The Glory Barn was our denomination's first worshipping structure. It was intentionally simple and decidedly lacking in ostentation. It was to be a simple space for common folk. Phineas Bresee would say unapologetically, that the Church of the Nazarene could get along without the rich. But she could not do without preaching the gospel to the poor" (Response? Are we true to our origin story as a denomination? Should we be?).

No Special Sanctity

Being poor doesn't make you holy. I have known poor people whose arrogance paved the path to their economic destruction. (So what does Jesus mean when he confers blessing on the poor? (Luke 6.20)) The faithful poor know things about God that I cannot know when it comes to reliance and trust (Agree? Disagree?).

Our Daily Bread

Jesus' daily bread prayer is an echo of the great Exodus narrative in which the Israelites were instructed to gather enough manna for that day, no hoarding resources, and no selfish grabs for more than your fair share. (Do you live a "daily bread" spirituality?)

Amos of Tekoa

God roars at God's people and the heart of God's indictment is this: Not only don't you care about the poor you are actually participating in their oppression. You exploit them for financial gain. You take more than your fair share. All this is a sign of your unfaithfulness to God. (How are we to hear Amos' message?)
