Sermon Reflection Guide Third Sunday of Advent 2016

Isaiah 35.1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp, the grass shall become reeds and rushes. A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way;

the unclean shall not travel on it. but it shall be for God's people; no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness,

and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Questions for Everyone

Joy

Joy is the response to very good news. Without good news, there is no joy. Happiness can be chosen. Joy can only be received. Agree? Why? Why not?

spiritual failure?

For Whom is this Good News?

This is good news for those whose identities are formed by their baptism into Christ's body as children of Abraham by faith in Jesus. This is good news for people who belong to the community over which Christ is sovereign. This is also good news for every Christian who has found their faith weakening, good news for every prodigal wondering if there is still a place for them at the table. This is good news for God's people who have seen better days. Spiritually speaking, having you seen better days?

Hope for Spiritual Failures

God's glory is revealed among a people gobsmacked by the ridiculous nature of God's unmerited favor bestowed upon spiritual failures. Joy is the only human emotion appropriate in response to this good news. This is exactly what Isaiah 35 is about. Isaiah 35 is an icon of hope for spiritual failures. Have you ever been a
