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
Apprentices in the way of Jesus must become masters of quadrant two because Jesus will never coerce us into doing anything, including prayer or worship. Formation in the way of Jesus will require Big Rock intention. Because if you don't get the Big Rocks in first, you'll never get them in later. The other quadrants will swallow up quadrant two. Might a reduction in quadrant four make room for quadrant two activities? Discuss what that might look like.

Persistent Prayer

"Wesley rediscovered what the church of his day had forgotten: prayer releases the power of God. He called prayer 'the grand means of drawing near to God' and found believing, persistent prayer to be the necessary first step to see God move. He modeled this conviction by devoting at least two hours a day to personal prayer and made fervent prayer a hallmark of the movement" (John Ross). Talk about a time when you persisted in prayer. Talk about a time when you prayed "fervently."

John Wesley's Covenant Prayer

I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed for you or laid aside for you, exalted for you or brought low for you. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you art mine, and I am yours. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

Sermon Reflection Guide

Luke 11.5-13

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.' And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs. So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Question for Everyone:

(1) I am the epitome of grace under pressure. (10) I freak out with the least little provocation. Where are you on this range?

In his sermon, Pastor Rob told the story about John Wesley's encounter with Moravian Christians on a storm -tossed ship. They remained poised and non-anxious. Wesley was terrified. This encounter led to some significant soul searching for the young minister. What might your number on the above range reveal about your faith?

The Way Your Pray Reveals What You Believe

Years ago, I learned that the way one prays reveals a lot about the person praying. Some folk pray in humbled and hushed tones reserved only for God. Others pray rather informally and casually as if talking to a friend. Some folk love the structure of fixed-hour prayers and the Divine Office. Others love Brother Lawrence's more conversational spirituality of practicing the presence of God in the most mundane circumstances. Whether or not one prays at all reveals a great deal about that person. People who don't pray and claim faith have some explaining to do it seems to me. It is like claiming friendship with a famous person with whom you've never spoken. Response? Would you say your prayer life is becoming more or less robust? Why? Why not?
