**John Woolman**  
1720-1772

John Woolman was a North American merchant, tailor, journalist, and itinerant Quaker preacher, and an early abolitionist in the colonial era.



**Sojourner Truth**  
1797-1883

Sojourner Truth was an American abolitionist and women's rights activist. Truth was born into slavery in Swartekill, New York, but escaped with her infant daughter to freedom in 1826.



**Catherine Booth**  
1820-1890

Catherine Booth was a compelling preacher and co-founder of the Salvation Army. She is known as "The Mother of The Salvation Army."



**Simone Weil**  
1909-1943

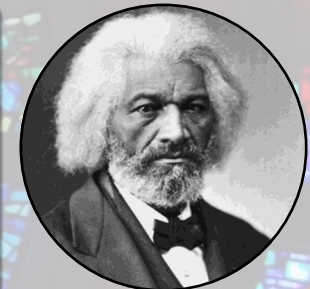
Simone Weil was a French philosopher, mystic, and political activist. Her persistent desire for truth and justice led her to both elite academies and factory floors, political praxis and spiritual solitude.

William Wilberforce was a British politician, philanthropist, and a leader of the movement to abolish the slave trade which led to the Slavery Abolition Act of 1833.

Frederick Douglass was an American social reformer, abolitionist, orator, writer, and statesman. After escaping from slavery in Maryland, he became a national leader of the abolitionist movement.

Karl Barth was the most important Swiss theologian of the twentieth century. He is considered to be one of the greatest thinkers within the history of the Christian tradition.

James Cone was an American theologian, best known for his advocacy of black theology and black liberation theology. His *Black Theology and Black Power* provided a new way to comprehensively define the distinctiveness of theology in the black church.
