We help the vulnerable among us.


We go into the world offering Jesus' invitation to gather at His Table.

Sermon Reflection Guide

Joel 2.21-29

Do not fear, O soil; be glad and rejoice, for the LORD has done great things! Do not fear, you animals of the field, for the pastures of the wilderness are green; the tree bears its fruit, the fig tree and vine give their full yield. O children of Zion, be glad and rejoice in the LORD your God; for he has given the early rain for your vindication, he has poured down for you abundant rain, the early and the later rain, as before. The threshing floors shall be full of grain, the vats shall overflow with wine and oil. I will repay you for the years that the swarming locust has eaten, the hopper, the destroyer, and the cutter, my great army, which I sent against you. You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied, and praise the name of the LORD your God, who has dealt wondrously with you. And my people shall never again be put to shame. You shall know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I, the LORD, am your God and there is no other. And my people shall never again be put to shame. Then afterward I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. Even on the male and female slaves, in those days, I will pour out my spirit.

Question for Everyone

We Celebrate the Ordination of Women

The practice of equity among men and women is an integral part of the work of Christ in the world because our Lord brings down bullies and lifts up the powerless. That's what Jesus' mom told us, a formidable woman in her own right. When you think about it, in light of Joel's vision, the ordination of women serves as an eschatological sign of the fullness of the reign of God coming in Christ. God is moving us by grace into the work of New Creation, a New Creation in which "sons and daughters shall prophesy." Radical egalitarian equity is the work of God's reign in the world. Response?

The Right Side of History in Romanian

I'd rather be on the right side of history and lose a battle knowing that God in Christ will win the Lamb's war by making all things new, including gender equality. Do you live on the "right side of history?" Does it matter to you how history will judge your actions or lack thereof?

Prophetic Hope

In the midst of an ecological catastrophe, the prophet dares hope. Through prophetic imagination, Joel sees the sovereign determination of God to usher in a New Age of abundance and human flourishing. Don't ever forget God's desire is abundance and flourishing. Response?

Catherine Booth

When people suggested that a woman's place was in the home, she wondered if the Christian church, which preached a liberating gospel to both men and women, could keep women from expressing their ministry gifts. She eventually concluded that a false interpretation of Paul's comment about women keeping silent in church had resulted in "loss to the church, evil to the world, and dishonor to God." Let's talk about gender roles and our "liberating gospel." .
