THE YEAR IN REVIEW: 7 Questions to Ask Yourself in Preparing for 2021

Mathew 23

¹ Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples: ²"The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. ³ So you must obey them and do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach. ⁴ They tie up heavy loads and put them

on men's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move them.
