What things can you depend on in life?

Philippians 3:1 Finally, my brothers and sisters, rejoice in the Lord! It's no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a safeguard for you.

What gets in the way of true joy and fulfillment?

Philippians 3:7-11 But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. 8 What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. 10 I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death,
