## The Bible Week #2: "How Do We Interpret the Bible?" **Pastor Kris Beckert**

The tools and principles used to interpret Scripture are called

I. Five tools that Christians use to interpret the Bible:

#### #1. The of the passage

- What comes before and after?
- Who says it?
- What's going on and where?
- #2. The situation
  - What was going on at the time it was written?

#### #3. What else does the Bible

• What other passages are about the topic?

#### #4. The meaning

- What is the simplest interpretation that makes sense?

#### #5. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ style and intent

• It is poetry, narrative, a letter, code of law, etc?

#### II. A Passage to interpret:

Luke 14:26 "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple."

#### 1. What is the \_\_\_\_\_?

- Three phases of Jesus' ministry in Luke:
  - 1. Everything's going great (Luke 3-9:50)
  - 2. Journey to Jerusalem and the cross (Luke 9:51-Luke 23)
  - 3. Resurrection and hope (Luke 24)

#### Turning point:

Luke 9:51-53 As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem. <sup>52</sup> And he sent messengers on ahead, who went into a Samaritan village to get things ready for him; <sup>53</sup> but the people there did not welcome him, because he was heading for Jerusalem.

#### Entire passage:

Luke 14:25-33 Large crowds were traveling with Jesus and turning to them, he said: <sup>26</sup> "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. <sup>27</sup> And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. <sup>28</sup> "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? <sup>29</sup> For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, <sup>30</sup> saying, 'This person began to build and wasn't able to finish.' <sup>31</sup> "Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? <sup>32</sup> If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. <sup>33</sup> In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples.
