1. Is there a time that you wish you could go back to? Why? What is the danger in trying to recreate or live in what was rather than what is?

3. Why did God take Ezekiel on a tour of the valley of dry bones first? What did the bones represent for Israel? For you?
4. Why must we take time to remember what/who died and to grieve?
5. What does it look like to prophesy TO the "dry bones" in our life? How have you experienced the power of the Word of God?
6. What difference does having God's Spirit make in our lives? Has there ever been a time in your life you looked all together but were empty inside?
7. Why is it important to recognize that the new life God brings WILL be different? What of the past do you need to let go and allow God to form in a new way?

II. God gives Ezekiel a vision of what is to come:

1. God takes him to _____ the valley

Ezekiel 37:1-3 The hand of the Lord was on me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the Lord and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. ² He led me back and forth among them, and I saw a great many bones on the floor of the valley, bones that were very dry. ³ He asked me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" I said, "Sovereign Lord, you alone know."

Ezekiel 37:4-6 Then he said to me, "Prophecy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord!' ⁵ This is what the Sovereign Lord says to these bones: I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life. ⁶ I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the Lord."

Ezekiel 37:7-8 So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. ⁸ I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.

3. God invites him to _____ to fill the valley

Ezekiel 37:9-10 Then he said to me, "Prophecy to the breath; prophecy, son of man, and say to it, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Come, breath, from the four winds and breathe into these slain, that they may live.'"

¹⁰ So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet—a vast army.

4. God declares the _____ will be _____ after the valley

Ezekiel 37:11-14 Then he said to me: "Son of man, these bones are the people of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up and our hope is gone; we are cut off.' ¹² Therefore prophecy and say to them: 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: My people, I am going to open your graves and bring you up from them; I will bring you back to the land of Israel. ¹³ Then you, my people, will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and bring you up from them. ¹⁴ I will put my Spirit in you and you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know that I the Lord have spoken, and I have done it, declares the Lord.'"
