How can we be faithful to Christ in the fire?

A Timeline of Daniel's Exile

- 605 BC—Jerusalem is sieged by Babylonians, Daniel is taken to Babylon, Nebuchadnezzar begins his reign as king
- 605-562 BC Daniel experiences
 Nebuchadnezzar's dreams, fiery furnace, and the king's humiliation
- **556-539 BC** Nabonidus rules Babylon, with his son, Belshazzar, co-ruling
- 553-539 BC Belshazzar rules Babylon, the hand writes on the wall during a party
- 539 BC the Babylonian empire falls to Cyrus
 the Persian, who kills Belshazzar, Darius the Mede
 is placed to rule, and the story of the lions' den

Daniel 6:1–3 It seemed good to Darius to appoint 120 satraps over the kingdom, that they would be in charge of the whole kingdom, ² and over them three commissioners (of whom Daniel was one), that these satraps might be accountable to them, and that the king might not suffer loss. ³ Then this Daniel began distinguishing himself among the commissioners and satraps because he possessed an extraordinary spirit, and the king planned to appoint him over the entire kingdom.

2.Daniel 6:4–9 Then the commissioners and satraps began trying to find a ground of accusation against Daniel in regard to government affairs; but they could find no ground of accusation or evidence of corruption, inasmuch as he was faithful, and no negligence or corruption was to be found in him. 5 Then these men said, "We will not find any ground of accusation against this Daniel unless we find it against him with regard to the law of his God." 6 Then these commissioners and satraps came by agreement to the king and spoke to him as follows: "King Darius, live forever! ⁷ All the commissioners of the kingdom, the prefects and the satraps, the high officials and the governors have consulted together that the king should establish a statute and enforce an injunction that anyone who makes a petition to any god or man besides you, O king, for thirty days, shall be cast into the lions' den. 8 Now, O king, establish the injunction and sign the document so that it may not be changed, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which may not be revoked." 9 Therefore King Darius signed the document, that is, the injunction. .
