2. What has been your understanding of what happens to us when we die? How did this message and Scripture impact, change, or affirm that belief?
3. In what ways do you see beliefs of Materialism and Dualism in our world today? How does the Christian belief in Resurrection differ from each?
4. Why does it matter what we believe about life after death? Why is bodily resurrection such a core belief of the Christian faith?
5. How does Paul describe what our new body will be like? Can you think of an analogy or illustration of this?
6. When will the resurrection of the dead happen?
7. How does a view of Resurrection change how you see your body? The created world? A life tragically cut short? What you do in this life?

What happens to our body after we die?

I. Two Popular Viewpoints in the 1st Century (Jesus' time)

1. _____: there is nothing after death
2. _____: the good spirit exits the evil body

II. The Christian and Jewish Viewpoint: _____

1 Corinthians 15:12-20 But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. ¹⁵ More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹ If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. ²⁰ But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

III. Three Questions about Resurrection:

1. Is resurrection of the body a core Christian belief?

2. What kind of body will it be?

1 Corinthians 15:35-37 But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body will they come?" ³⁶ How foolish! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. ³⁷ When you sow, you do not plant the body that will be, but just a seed, perhaps of wheat or of something else.

1 Corinthians 15:42-44 So will it be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; ⁴³ it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; ⁴⁴ it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body.

3. When does resurrection happen?

1 Corinthians 15:51-53 Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed— ⁵² in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. ⁵³ For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality.

4. Why does any of this matter?

1 Corinthians 15:54-58 When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." ⁵⁵ "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" ⁵⁶ The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. ⁵⁷ But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁵⁸ Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain
